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# INTRODUCTION

Years ago, in the middle of a broken marriage and my own character struggles, the Lord gave me a revelation that changed my life. He taught me the power of **binding and loosing**. I didn't learn it from a sermon or a book — I learned it in the middle of my mess. And it worked. God used it to break sin and iniquity that had followed me for years.

Later, after we started our church, everything became difficult. We prayed, preached, and served, but nothing produced results. I grew frustrated and angry. I watched sinners prosper and preachers living in sin while their ministries grew. I felt forgotten. Eventually, I quit. I walked away from God, the church, and the ministry.

But God never walked away from me.

During a medical emergency, He met me again. He called me back and told me to teach His people to put their faith in what Jesus has already done — not in feelings, works, or religion.

One evening, while sharing with my wife Toni what the Lord had been showing me about authority, she asked, “Are you going to write the book *Tell Hell NO?*” The next morning, I woke up with these words burning in my spirit: **“Take My Word and fight the devil.”**

That's when it hit me. The revelation God gave me years earlier was the missing link — the reason things didn't work the way they should have when we first started the ministry. It was the power of binding and loosing.

God showed me it wasn't just for my marriage or for breaking sin. It works in **every area of life**. And if I wanted victory, I had to stop letting the devil run over me. I had to take a stubborn stance on the inside and say:

**“TELL HELL NO!”** This book is simple. It's practical. It's for everyday people who want real victory. Jesus already won it. Our job is to enforce it.

# PART 1

## YOUR SPIRITUAL RIGHTS IN CHRIST

### Section 1 The Battle Cry of the Church: TELL HELL NO

There are times in life when you must make a decision on the inside that enough is enough. Jesus came to give us life, and life more abundantly (John 10:10). But that abundant life does not fall on us automatically. We must stand up and fight for what belongs to us in Christ.

The Lord told me years ago that the church needed a battle cry. Not a slogan. Not a cute saying. A **battle cry**. And that cry is simple:

#### **TELL HELL NO!**

Why? Because if we don't stand up and fight for our spiritual rights, we will never walk in them. Israel had to fight for the Promised Land in the Old Covenant. And under the New Covenant, we must fight to enter the rest Jesus died to give us (Hebrews 4:9–11). Jesus is our Promised Land Rest, but we must take hold of it.

The Bible tells us plainly that we have an adversary. Not a person. Not a family member. Not a boss. Not a spouse.

#### **The adversary is the devil.**

He walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour (1 Peter 5:8–9). But the Word also tells us to resist him — *steadfast in the faith*. That means we don't run. We don't hide. We don't fold. We stand our ground.

And here's the good news: Jesus has already defeated him.

Colossians 2:15 says Jesus **disarmed** principalities and powers and made a public show of them. The devil is not a lion — he only **acts** like one. His roar is fake. His power is broken. But he counts on believers not knowing their rights.

This is why you must take a stubborn stance on the inside. A stance that says:

**“I believe what Jesus has done for me, and I refuse to back down.”**

You must let the forces of darkness know that you are not fighting in your own strength. You are standing in the finished work of Christ. Jesus defeated every principality and power, and He did it **for you**.

Paul prayed that the eyes of your understanding would be opened so you could see the hope of your calling, the riches of God’s inheritance in you, and the exceeding greatness of His power toward those who believe (Ephesians 1:17–22). That same power raised Jesus from the dead and seated Him far above all principality and power.

And here’s the part most believers miss:

**You are seated with Him.** (Ephesians 2:6)

That means you fight from victory, not for victory. You enforce what Jesus already won.

This is why the battle cry matters. This is why the church must rise up. This is why you must open your mouth and declare what Jesus had done for you.

## Section 2 Know Your Adversary, Know Your Victory

One of the biggest mistakes believers make is fighting the wrong enemy. We get mad at people, situations, and circumstances, but the Bible is clear — **people are not the problem.**

The Word says we have an adversary, and it tells us exactly who he is:

**“Your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour.”** (*1 Peter 5:8–9*)

The devil is the one behind the pressure, the confusion, the attacks, and the resistance. He is the one trying to wear you down. But here’s the part many believers miss:

**He can only devour the ones who let him.**

The Bible says he walks around *seeking whom he may devour*. That means he can’t devour everyone. He looks for open doors — fear, doubt, ignorance, and passivity.

That’s why the Word tells us to be sober and vigilant. Not scared. Not nervous. Just alert.

And then it tells us exactly what to do:

**“Resist him, steadfast in the faith.”**

You don’t resist with emotions. You don’t resist with tears. You don’t resist by complaining. You resist with **faith** — faith in what Jesus has already done.

The Bible also tells us what we are really fighting:

**“We do not wrestle against flesh and blood...”** (*Ephesians 6:12*)

Your fight is not with people. Your fight is with principalities, powers, rulers of darkness, and spiritual wickedness. But here's the good news:

**Jesus already defeated every one of them.**

Colossians 2:15 says Jesus **disarmed** them. He stripped them of their authority. He made a public show of them. He triumphed over them.

So if Jesus defeated them, why do they still attack?

Because the devil is a trespasser. He only stops when someone with authority tells him to stop.

That someone is **you**.

This is why you must know your adversary — not to fear him, but to recognize his tactics and shut him down. And you must know your victory — not someday, not in Heaven, but right now.

Jesus is seated far above all principality and power. And the Bible says **you are seated with Him**. (*Ephesians 2:6*)

That means:

- You fight from a higher position
- You fight from victory, not for victory
- You enforce what Jesus already won
- You resist with authority, not emotion

When you understand this, everything changes. You stop being a victim. You stop being confused. You stop letting the devil push you around.

You rise up on the inside and **TELL HELL NO! “No. Not today. Not in my house. Not in my mind. Not in my family. TELL HELL NO.”**

### Section 3 Your Position in Christ

One of the biggest reasons believers struggle is because they don't know where they are seated. They know Jesus is victorious, but they don't realize they share in that victory. They know Jesus has authority, but they don't understand that He gave that authority to them.

The Bible says something powerful that most Christians read but never fully grasp:

In *Ephesians 2:6* it reads; **“And raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus.”**

This means your position is not on the earth trying to climb your way up. Your position is **with Christ**, seated in authority, far above the enemy.

Paul prayed that the eyes of our understanding would be enlightened to understand this, so we could see this clearly. He wanted us to know:

1. the hope of our calling
2. the riches of God's inheritance in us
3. and the exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe (*Ephesians 1:17–22*)

This is the same power that raised Jesus from the dead. The same power that seated Him far above all principality and power. The same power that put all things under His feet.

And here's the part that changes everything:

**If it's under His feet, it's under your feet.**

You are not fighting from below. You are not trying to climb your way to victory. You are not begging God to do something He already did.



You are seated with Christ — in a place of authority.

This is why the devil fights your identity so hard. If he can keep you thinking small, weak, defeated, or unworthy, he can keep you from using the authority Jesus gave you. But once you understand your position, everything shifts.

You stop praying like a victim. You stop begging God to fix things. You stop letting the enemy push you around.

You start speaking with authority. You start commanding things to line up with the Word. You start enforcing what Jesus already won.

This is what it means to take your seat.

You don't fight for victory — you fight **from** victory. You don't try to win — you enforce the win Jesus already secured. You don't run from the enemy — the enemy runs from you.

When you know your position, you can boldly say:

**“I am seated with Christ. I have authority. And I TELL HELL NO!”**

## PART 2

# SPIRITUAL WARFARE & YOUR AUTHORITY

### Section 1 Binding the Strong Man

If you want to take back what belongs to you, Jesus made something very clear: you must first deal with the strong man.

**“No one can enter a strong man’s house and plunder his goods, unless he first binds the strong man.”** *(Mark 3:27 NKJV)*

This is not deep. It’s simple. It’s practical. And it works.

The strong man is the enemy — the devil — and he tries to hold onto anything he can: your peace, your marriage, your finances, your health, your children, your purpose, your confidence, your calling. He doesn’t own any of it, but he will try to control it if you let him.

Jesus said you must **bind** him first. Not negotiate. Not beg. Not cry. Not hope. **Bind.**

Binding means to not allow, when you do this you stop his activity. You shut down his influence. You take authority over what he’s trying to do and Heaven backs you up because you are exercising your will to Choose Jesus and what He has done for you. And no one has the right to violate your will, not even God Himself. Many believers struggle because they don't know this.

It is the devil that seeks to keep us from experiencing what Jesus has provided for us. To take what belongs to us in Jesus we must without first binding the enemy who is holding it or hindering it from being a reality in our lives.

The good news: you have the authority to bind the devil, and kicking the gates of hell that are trying to keep what Jesus has done for us from coming to us.

**“The weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds.” (2 Corinthians 10:4 NKJV)**

Your weapon is the Word. Your authority comes from Jesus. Your stance comes from your position in Christ.

Jesus said: in *Matthew 16:19 NKJV*; **“Whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.”**

Heaven backs you up when you enforce the word of God in your life against the forces of darkness. Heaven responds when you take your stubborn stance and Tell Hell No!

So take your stubborn stance in your heart on the Victory you have in Jesus. Bind the enemy by saying inside yourself, Hell No!. and Loose by saying what belongs to you in Jesus .

Take it all back,

- your peace
- your joy
- your finances
- your marriage
- your purpose
- your calling

- your freedom
- your victory

And Jesus promised something else:

**“You shall reap if you do not faint.”** (*Galatians 6:9 NKJV*)

The enemy wants you tired. He wants you discouraged. He wants you to quit. Because he knows if you keep standing, you will reap.

Binding the strong man is not a one-time event. It's a lifestyle of authority. It's a mindset of victory. It's a stubborn stance on the inside that says:

**“Devil, you will not run my life. You will not touch what belongs to me. I bind your activity, IN THE NAME OF JESUS, HELL I TELL YOU NO!**

## Section 2

### **Agreement, Binding, Loosing, and Commanding**

Many believers pray without results because they don't understand the authority of agreement, the power of binding and loosing, and the role of commanding the Word. Prayer is not just asking — it is enforcing. It is not just hoping — it is declaring. It is not just emotional — it is legal.

Jesus said, **“Again I say to you that if two of you agree on earth concerning anything that they ask, it will be done for them by My Father in heaven.” — Matthew 18:19**

Agreement is powerful. Agreement is spiritual alignment. Agreement is Heaven's legal permission to act. When two believers agree in faith, they create a spiritual contract that Heaven honors. That's why the enemy fights unity — because agreement activates authority.

Jesus also said, **“Whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.” — Matthew 18:18**

Binding and loosing are legal terms. **To bind** means to restrict, forbid, shut down. **To loose** means to release, permit, activate.

You bind the enemy's activity. You loose God's will. You bind confusion. You loose peace. You bind sickness. You loose healing. You bind lack. You loose provision.

You are not just praying — **you are legislating**. You are not just hoping — **you are enforcing**. You are not just reacting — **you are commanding**.

The Word says, “**Are they not all ministering spirits sent forth to minister for those who will inherit salvation?**” — **Hebrews 1:14**

Angels respond to the Word. They do not respond to emotion. They do not respond to fear. They do not respond to begging. They respond to the Word of God spoken in faith.

That’s why you must speak the Word. That’s why you must command the Word. That’s why you must declare what God said.

**You are not commanding God — you are commanding the situation with God’s Word.**

When Jesus spoke to the storm, He didn’t beg. He didn’t plead. He didn’t explain. He said, “**Peace, be still.**” — **Mark 4:39**

That is commanding authority. That is spiritual enforcement. That is how you speak to storms, sickness, lack, fear, and confusion.

This is how you operate in spiritual warfare:

**Agree in faith. Bind the enemy. Loose God’s will. Speak the Word. Command the situation. Activate angelic**

**assistance. Declare peace, healing, provision, and victory.**

And when the enemy tries to resist, you rise up and say:

**“No. I bind you. I loose God’s will. I speak the Word. I command the storm to stop. I enforce Heaven’s authority. And I TELL HELL NO.”**

### Section 3 Using Your Authority in the Earth

Authority is not a feeling. Authority is not a mood. Authority is not something you “work up.” Authority is what Jesus **gave** you.

He said:

**“Behold, I give you the authority to trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall by any means hurt you.”** (*Luke 10:19 NKJV*)

Not someday. Not when you feel strong. Not when you think you deserve it. He gave it to you the moment you received Him as your saviour.

The problem is not that believers don’t *have* authority. The problem is that most believers don’t believe it and **use** it.

They pray, but they don’t command. They cry, but they don’t resist. They hope, but they don’t enforce. They wait on God, while God is waiting on them.

Jesus never said, “I will rebuke the devil for you.” He said **you** resist him and he will flee from you. (*James 4:7*)

He never said, “I will bind the enemy for you.” He said **whatever you bind** will be bound. (*Matthew 16:19*)

He never said, “I will speak to your mountain.” He said **whoever says** to this mountain... (*Mark 11:23*)

He gave **you** the authority. Heaven backs **you** when you use it.



**You are to take the Word and fight the devil with it.**

You fight by speaking the Word. You fight by commanding the enemy to release what belongs to you. You fight by enforcing the victory Jesus already won by using the authority that you have in Jesus.

**Authority sounds like this:**

- “I command my money to come to me now, in The Name of the Lord Jesus Christ!”
- “I bind every attack against my mind, **The Name of Jesus!**”
- “I loose peace, healing, and provision, **The Name of Jesus!**”
- “I command every hindrance to move, **The Name of Jesus!**”
- “I take my stance on the Word of God over this situation, and I enforce it in my life, **The Name of Jesus!**”

This is not arrogance. This is not pride. This is **legal authority**.

It is the job a police officer to enforce the law, but it is the job of a judge to uphold the law when it is broken or a person's rights are being violated. You must take the Law and legal rights you have in Christ Jesus and enforce them against hell — you enforce the Word of God with **your mouth**.

Your authority is backed by heaven because you believe in:

- the blood of Jesus
- the name of Jesus
- the Word of God
- the angels of God
- the victory of the cross
- the power of the resurrection
- your position in Christ

**When you speak the Word, angels move.** (*Psalm 103:20*) When you resist the devil, he flees. (*James 4:7*) When you command the mountain, it moves. (*Mark 11:23*)

This is how you stop being a victim. This is how you stop living defeated. This is how you take back your life in Christ.

You rise up on the inside and say:

**“Devil, I use my authority. I enforce the Word of what the Lord has done for me. And I TELL HELL NO.”**

## PART 3

# ENFORCING YOUR COVENANT RIGHTS

### Section 1 — Evicting the Devil from Your Life

Many believers live as victims, not because the devil is strong, but because they have forgotten what Jesus already gave them. The first step in evicting the enemy from your life is simple:

**Stop being a victim.** You cannot walk in victory while thinking like someone who is defeated. You cannot enforce your rights while believing you have none. You cannot cast out the enemy while feeling powerless against him.

Jesus already broke his power. **Your job is to enforce what Jesus already accomplished.**

**Walk in the victory Christ already gave.** Victory is not something you are trying to get. Victory is something Jesus already won and handed to you.

The Word says, **“In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace.” — Ephesians 1:7**

Redemption means **bought back, paid for, legally restored.** You are not trying to get free — you **ARE** free. Now you must enforce that freedom.

**You must claim what Jesus paid for.** If Jesus paid for it, you have a right to it. If Jesus redeemed it, you can claim it. If Jesus provided it, you can enforce it.

**Healing. Peace. Provision. Protection. Authority. Victory.**

These are not “maybe” blessings — they are **blood-bought rights**.

**Fight the good fight of faith.** The good fight is the fight you win.

Faith is not passive. Faith is not silent. Faith is not weak. — 1

**Timothy 6:12**

Faith takes what Jesus provided. Faith claims what belongs to you.

Faith refuses to let the enemy steal anything Jesus paid for.

**Forget not all His benefits.** You are not just saved — you are a beneficiary of the covenant. — **Psalms 103:2**

A beneficiary is someone who has a legal right to receive what was promised. You don't beg for benefits. You claim them.

**Healing is a benefit. Deliverance is a benefit. Provision is a benefit. Protection is a benefit. Authority is a benefit.**

You are a **legal beneficiary** of the covenant. This is why you can evict the devil. This is why you can resist him. This is why he must flee. This is why he cannot stay where he is not legally allowed.

You are **not fighting for victory — you are fighting from victory.**

You are **not trying to get free — you are enforcing the freedom Jesus already purchased.**

You are **not trying to overcome — you are standing in the One who already overcame.**

This is how you evict the devil from your life:

**Stop being a victim Stand in your redemption Claim what Jesus paid for Fight the good fight of faith Remember your covenant benefits Enforce your legal rights in Christ**

And when the enemy tries to push back, you look him in the face and say:

**“No. You’re not staying. Jesus paid for my freedom. I enforce it. I claim it. I walk in it. And I TELL HELL NO.”**

## Section 2 Taking Back What Belongs to You

If you are going to enforce your covenant rights, you must understand that everything Jesus purchased for you belongs to you right now. You are not trying to convince God to give you something. You are not trying to persuade Heaven to move. You are simply taking back what already has your name on it. Jesus paid for it. The covenant guarantees it. Your faith enforces it.

The Word makes something very clear: **the Kingdom of God does not advance through passivity.** It advances through force — spiritual force. Jesus said, **“The violent take it by force.” — Matthew 11:12** This is not natural violence. This is spiritual determination. This is the believer who refuses to let the enemy hold anything Jesus paid for. This is the believer who says, “If Jesus bought it, I’m taking it.”

You don’t beg for what Jesus paid for. **You enforce it.** You don’t negotiate with the enemy. **You evict him.** The devil does not respond to begging, crying, or hoping. He responds to authority — the authority of a believer who knows their rights in Christ and refuses to back down.

This is why the Word says, **“Resist the devil and he will flee from you.” — James 4:7** Resist means to stand your ground. Resist means to push back. Resist means to refuse to surrender anything the enemy is trying to hold. When you resist, he doesn’t stroll away — he flees. He runs. He loses his grip. He cannot hold what you legally claim in the name of Jesus.

Your rights are **legal, blood-bought, and Heaven-backed.** They are not emotional. They are not based on how you feel. They are based on what Jesus accomplished. And because they are legal rights, they

must be **claimed**, **spoken**, and **enforced**. Nothing in the Kingdom is automatic. Everything must be taken by faith.

You take back your peace. You take back your joy. You take back your finances. You take back your marriage. You take back your purpose. You take back your calling. You take back your freedom. You take back your victory.

Not by begging. Not by hoping. Not by waiting. But by enforcing your covenant rights with the authority of Jesus.

This is how you take back what belongs to you:

**Stand your ground. Speak the Word. Resist the enemy. Enforce your rights. Refuse to back down. Take it by force.**

And when the enemy tries to hold onto what Jesus paid for, you look him in the face and say:

**“No. That belongs to me. Jesus paid for it. I claim it. I enforce it. I take it back. And I TELL HELL NO.”**

## Section 3 Living from Your Spirit, Not Your Emotions

If you are going to enforce your covenant rights, you must learn to live from your spirit and not from your emotions. Emotions are real, but they are not reliable. They change. They fluctuate. They react. Your spirit, however, is anchored in the Word of God, empowered by the Holy Spirit, and rooted in the victory Jesus already secured. You cannot win spiritual battles by fighting out of your feelings. You win by standing in who you are in Christ.

The Word says, **“Be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might.” — Ephesians 6:10** Your strength is not emotional strength. It is not mental strength. It is not willpower. Your strength is spiritual — it comes from the Lord. When you live from your spirit, you draw from His strength, not your own. When you live from your emotions, you are up one day and down the next. But when you live from your spirit, you are steady, stable, and unshakable.

**This is why emotional fighting always loses.** Emotional fighting reacts to circumstances. Spiritual fighting responds with the Word. Emotional fighting complains. Spiritual fighting commands. Emotional fighting is moved by what it sees. Spiritual fighting is moved by what God said.

To live from your spirit, you must stay connected to the Holy Spirit. **Praying in the Spirit** strengthens your inner man, builds your faith, and keeps your heart aligned with God’s will. When you pray in the Spirit, you rise above your emotions and step into the authority Jesus gave you. You stop reacting to the enemy and start ruling over him.

Living from your spirit also means **speaking from your spirit**. Your words carry authority when they come from the Word of God, not from frustration or fear. When the enemy pushes, your emotions may want to panic, but your spirit says, **“No! The Word says...”** That is the



stubborn stance you take on the inside — the stance that refuses to bow to pressure, refuses to surrender ground, and refuses to let the enemy dictate your life.

This is how you win victory after victory after victory. Not by feeling strong, but by **being strong in the Lord**. Not by reacting emotionally, but by responding spiritually. Not by letting your feelings lead you, but by letting your spirit dominate your life.

This is how you live from your spirit:

**Be strong in the Lord. Pray in the Spirit. Speak the Word. Refuse emotional reactions. Take your stubborn stance. Stand on what God said.**

And when the enemy tries to pull you into emotional chaos, you rise up in your spirit and declare:

**“No. I don’t live by how I feel. I live by what God said. I stand in the Spirit. I enforce my rights. I walk in victory. And I TELL HELL NO.”**

# CONCLUSION

## YOUR NEW STANCE OF VICTORY

You are not the same believer you were when you started this book. You now know your rights. You now understand your authority. You now recognize the enemy's tactics. You now see clearly what Jesus has already provided. And you now know how to enforce your covenant with boldness, confidence, and spiritual strength.

The days of living defeated are over. The days of emotional fighting are over. The days of begging God for what He already gave you are over. You have stepped into a new level of spiritual maturity — a level where you stand your ground, resist the enemy, enforce your rights, and take back everything Jesus paid for.

This is your new stance:

**I know who I am. I know what belongs to me. I know what Jesus paid for. I know how to enforce my rights. I know how to resist the enemy. I know how to stand in victory.**

And from this day forward, whenever the enemy tries to touch your life, your mind, your family, your finances, your purpose, or your future, you will not panic. You will not fear. You will not fold. You will rise up in your spirit and declare with authority:

**“Devil, you’re not staying. You’re not touching anything that belongs to me. Jesus paid for my freedom. I enforce it. I claim it. I walk in it. And I TELL HELL NO.”**

This is your covenant. This is your authority. This is your victory. And this is your life from now on.
