### Introduction

Scripture Anchor: Isaiah 55:8-9

"For My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways," declares the Lord. "For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways and My thoughts than your thoughts."

- God's thoughts and ways are higher than human ways.
- To think like God, His Word must be planted in the heart and watered through meditation.
- Memorization alone is not belief; true faith is rooted in the heart.
- Principle: "For as he thinks in his heart, so is he" (Proverbs 23:7).
- Focus: The Kingdom operates by the seed of the Word being planted in the heart and producing fruit.

## Section 1: Keeping the Garden of Our Heart

## Scripture Anchors:

- Proverbs 4:23
  - "Keep your heart with all diligence, for out of it spring the issues of life."
- Mark 4:26–27

"And He said, 'The kingdom of God is as if a man should scatter seed on the ground, and should sleep by night and rise by day, and the seed should sprout and grow, he himself does not know how."

• Luke 6:45

"A good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart brings forth evil. For out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks."

 Matthew 12:37
 "For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned."

#### What This Section Includes:

## • Principles:

- The heart is God's garden; what is planted there will grow.
- Word planted → faith, healing, prosperity.
- Junk planted → fear, doubt, corruption.

## • Applications:

- Guard your heart by guarding ears, eyes, and words.
- Be selective about teaching—receive only Christ-centered, scripture-based messages.
- Reject philosophies of men or doctrines that deny healing.

### • Illustrations:

- Seed on a shelf does nothing until planted.
- Soil naturally grows what is sown—so does the heart.
- Courtroom metaphor: your words testify for or against you.

## Practical Examples:

- Healing manifests when the Word of healing is planted and believed.
- Prosperity requires meditating on scriptures of provision.
- Guarding against false teaching prevents "weeds" from choking faith.

## Section 2: Meditation is the Key to Roots & Fruits Scripture Anchors:

### Joshua 1:8

"This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night,

that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success."

### • Psalm 1:2-3

"But his delight is in the law of the Lord, and in His law he meditates day and night. He shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that brings forth its fruit in its season, whose leaf also shall not wither; and whatever he does shall prosper."

### • Hebrews 11:6

"But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him."

• Romans 10:11 "For the Scripture says, 'Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame."

### What This Section Includes:

## • Principles:

- Meditation = watering the seed of the Word.
- Develops strong roots → stability.
- Produces lasting fruits → healing, prosperity, wisdom, peace.

## Applications:

- Muse on scripture daily (speak, think, pray).
- Write notes, revisit them, pray over them.
- Let the Holy Spirit teach and reveal principles.
- Expect God to honor His Word—faith without expectation is incomplete.

### • Illustrations:

- Woman with issue of blood (Mark 5:25–34)
  kept saying in her heart until faith produced action.
- Meditation is like catching balance on a bicycle—you must be positioned to catch revelation.
- Tree planted by rivers of water = stability and fruitfulness in season.

## Practical Steps:

- o Daily planting: read and confess scripture.
- Daily watering: meditate, pray, muse on the Word.
- Guarding: filter what enters through ears, eyes, and mouth.
- Speaking: declare God's promises over circumstances.
- Expecting: anticipate God's Word to manifest.

### **Conclusion**

- Summary: Valuing the ways of the Kingdom means:
  - o Planting the Word in the heart.
  - Guarding the heart as God's garden.
  - Watering the Word through meditation.
  - o Expecting fruit in due season.
