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Review – Definition of Cultivation

Scripture:

2 Timothy 2:6–7 — *“The hardworking farmer must be first to partake of the crops. Consider what I say, and may the Lord give you understanding in all things.”*

- Cultivation means yielding to God’s way of preparing our hearts.
- Just like a farmer prepares soil before planting, we prepare our hearts through prayer, study, and openness to the Word.
- Purpose: to bear fruit and become productive sons and daughters in His Kingdom.

Introduction

Scripture:

Mark 4:26–29 — *“The kingdom of God is as if a man should scatter seed on the ground...”*

Galatians 6:8–9 — *“...he who sows to the Spirit will of the Spirit reap everlasting life... let us not grow weary, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose*

- The heart is God’s garden.
- Weeds are dream killers — they choke and destroy the Word before fruit can grow.
- Jesus came to give abundant life, but the enemy plants weeds to block God’s dream for us.
- Once the seed is planted, we rest in faith, not stress. Growth happens “first the blade, then the head, then the full grain.”

Section 1: The Roadside Heart (Review)

Scripture:

Matthew 13:19 — *“When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the wicked one comes and snatches away what was sown in his heart.”*

Jeremiah 4:3 — *“Break up your fallow ground, and do not sow among thorns.”*

Hosea 10:12 — *“...break up your fallow ground, for it is time to seek the Lord.”*

- A hardened heart, like seed sown on the roadside, cannot grow.
- Life's hurts and disappointments make areas of the heart resistant to God's Word.
- The devil uses circumstances to trample hearts, producing bitterness and resistance.
- Only intercessory prayer and God's reign of love can soften such hearts.
- Honest prayer breaks up fallow ground. Tell God your hurts, anger, and struggles — honesty opens the door for healing.

Section 2: The Rocky Heart (Review)

Scripture:

Luke 22:31–32 — *“Simon, Simon, indeed Satan has asked for you, that he may sift you as wheat. But I have prayed for you, that your faith should not fail...”*

- A heart with impurities and obstacles, like rocky soil.
- Trials sift us, exposing weak foundations and burning away religious systems.
- God allows testing to refine us, removing “rocks” so His Word can take root.
- Flour must be sifted to remove clumps; likewise, our hearts must be refined through testing.

Section 3: The Thorny Heart (Recognizing Weeds)

Scripture:

Mark 4:16–17 — *“...the worries of this life, the deceitfulness of wealth, and desires for other things choke the word, making it unfruitful.”*

Proverbs 4:23 — *“Keep your heart with all diligence, for out of it spring the issues of life.”*

- A heart where weeds (cares, distractions, desires) choke out the Word.
- Weeds include condemnation, guilt, shame, triggers, family hurts, generational curses, religious pride, strongholds, and fear of failure.
- Weeds lie dormant until conditions awaken them. They creep in through thoughts, memories, associations, and lies of the enemy.
- If unchecked, they choke the Word before fruit can grow.
- Guard your heart diligently. Remove weeds through prayer, repentance, and continual nourishment of God's Word.
- Breakthrough often comes right after the enemy intensifies attacks — don't abort your harvest.

Closing Charge

Scripture:

- Galatians 6:9 — *“Let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart.”*
- Weeds are subtle but deadly. Recognize them, uproot them, and guard your heart.
- Fruitfulness requires continual cultivation, prayer, and honesty with God.
- The Word of God is good seed — nurture it until it produces healing, deliverance, prosperity, and identity in Christ.
