When Jesus Is in Your Mouth, Victory Is in Your Life

I discovered this truth at the beginning of my marriage. I was facing some character issues that were affecting my relationship with my wife. I didn't want to lose my wife or my children over it. **So I began to cry out to God for help.** Some one in the Church I was attending gave me a book titled: '**Revers The Curse**'

In desperation I read it and discovered the spiritual law of **binding and loosing** — that the works of the flesh must be bound, and the fruit of the Spirit must be loosed. And I began **speaking Galatians 5:16–24 over my Life and It changed me.**

"Hindsight is always 20/20 because I didn't realize how important this truth was. I abandoned it. I walked away from ministry, and I eventually had to be restored from a backslidden condition. **My marriage never faltered, but my relationship with God did.** And when the Lord called me back, He showed me that the very truth I had walked away from was the key to success in every area of life."

Now that I have returned to the call of ministry, the **Lord has opened my eyes to understand how vital this truth really is** — and **He has instructed me to apply the principle in every area of my life and to begin sharing it with His people.**

PART 1 — The Law of Binding, Loosing, and Speaking Faith

Section 1 BINDING AND LOOSING

Matthew 16:13–19 teaches us that Jesus gave the Church the keys of the Kingdom, and one of those keys is the spiritual law of binding and loosing.

Binding stops the works of the enemy, and loosing releases the will of God. Heaven backs what you bind and loose when you speak in agreement with the Word.

This is not emotional and it is not begging—this is authority. Jesus said, “Whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven,” and “Whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.”

This means the believer has the right to shut down what is not of God and release what God has already provided in Christ.

THE PRACTICAL APPLICATION OF BINDING AND LOOSING

Galatians 5:16–24 shows us how to apply this truth. When you see the works of the flesh listed in the Word, you have the authority to bind them. When you see the fruit of the Spirit listed in the Word, you have the authority to loose them. This is how you take authority over your flesh and walk in the Spirit.

Each morning, throughout the day, and before you go to bed, you can say, “In the name of Jesus, I bind the works of the flesh in me, which are adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, idolatry, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, envy, murders, drunkenness,

revelries, and such like.” You are not claiming these works of the flesh as your identity—you are binding them so they have no authority or operation in your life.

Then you can say, “And I loose in the name of Jesus the fruit of the Spirit in me: love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such there is no law.” You are loosing what God has already placed in your born-again spirit.

Another powerful application is found in Job 31:1: “I have made a covenant with my eyes.” Speaking this out loud is how you take authority over what you allow into your heart and mind.

Binding removes what is not of God, and loosing releases what God has already given you. Speaking the Word activates spiritual law, and heaven responds to your authority. This is how you walk in the Spirit and not fulfill the lust of the flesh.

SECTION 2 THE FAITH PRINCIPLE:

BELIEVE IN THE HEART & SPEAK WITH THE MOUTH

Romans 10:9–10 shows us that everything we receive from God follows the same pattern. We believe in our hearts, and we speak with our mouths. This is how we were saved, and this is how we receive every promise of God.

The Word says, “For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.” This means your heart believes what God has said, and your mouth agrees with it. When your heart and your mouth come into agreement with the Word, faith is released.

2 Corinthians 4:13 says, “I believed, and therefore I spoke.” The spirit of faith always speaks what it believes. Faith is not silent. Faith does not wait to see something before speaking. Faith speaks because it believes what God has already said.

Romans 10:6 calls this “the righteousness of faith,” and it says that righteousness speaks. It does not say, “I need to see Jesus first.” It believes the Word, and then it speaks the Word. This is how the believer walks in the reality of what Jesus has done.

SECTION 3

THE FAITH PRINCIPLE: BELIEVING AND SPEAKING

PART 2 — God's Mode of Operation and the Believer's Victory

Section 1

SPEAKING WHAT IS WRITTEN

Luke 4:1–13 shows us that Jesus defeated the devil by speaking the Word. Every time the enemy came against Him, Jesus answered with, “It is written.” He did not argue with the devil. He did not explain Himself. He did not negotiate. He spoke the Word, and the Word carried the authority.

This is the pattern for every believer. If Jesus used the written Word to defeat the enemy, then we must do the same. Victory is not in our emotions. Victory is not in our feelings. Victory is in the Word that we speak in faith. When the Word is in your mouth, the authority of Jesus is in your mouth.

Ephesians 6:17 calls the Word of God “the sword of the Spirit.” This means the Word is not just information—it is a weapon. It is the weapon the Holy Spirit uses through your mouth to defeat the enemy and enforce the victory Jesus has already given you.

When you speak the Word, you are not fighting in your own strength. You are fighting with God’s strength. The authority is not in your emotions or your personality. The authority is in the Word itself. The devil does not respond to feelings, but he must respond to the Word spoken in faith.

Hebrews 4:12 says the Word of God is “living and powerful.” It is alive. It is active. It works every time it is spoken in faith. When the Word comes out of your mouth, it cuts through lies, breaks strongholds, and destroys the enemy’s strategies.

Luke 10:19 tells us that Jesus has given us authority over all the power of the enemy. That authority is activated when we speak the Word. When you

declare what God has said, you shut down the enemy's influence and enforce the victory Jesus already won for you. The devil cannot override the Word. He cannot stand against the Word. He must bow to the Word.

1 Peter 5:8–9 tells us to resist the devil by being steadfast in the faith. Faith speaks. Faith answers. Faith responds with the Word. When you speak what is written, the enemy loses his grip. He loses his voice. He loses his access. Speaking the Word is how you resist him and stand your ground.

This is how Jesus overcame temptation, pressure, and every attack of the enemy. He spoke what was written. And this is how you overcome as well. Speaking the Word is how you silence accusations, shut down lies, and defeat every strategy of the enemy.

The Word in your heart gives you faith.

The Word in your mouth gives you victory.

The Word spoken in faith gives you authority.

When the Word is in your heart and in your mouth, victory is in your mouth. The Word of God is your weapon, and when you speak it, heaven backs you.

SECTION 2

GOD'S MODE OF OPERATION

Romans 4:17 reveals God's mode of operation. God calls those things which do not exist as though they did. He speaks from the spirit realm, and what He speaks becomes reality. God does not speak based on what He sees. He speaks based on what He has already established in the spirit.

We serve the God who speaks things about us that are not yet visible in the natural. They are true in the spirit first. When we agree with what God has said, even when we cannot see it yet, He brings it to pass in our lives.

Agreement with God activates His Word.

Joel 3:10 says, "Let the weak say, 'I am strong.'" God told weak people to call themselves strong. This may seem strange to the natural mind, but this is how God operates. He tells you to say what He has said, not what you feel. When you speak what God says, you honor His Word, and He honors your faith.

1 Corinthians 1:27–28 shows us that God uses the things that are not to bring to nothing the things that are. **God brings to nothing the things that are so His Word can be.** When you speak the Word over your life, God uses your agreement with His Word to cancel what is against you and establish what He has promised you.

This is why 1 Corinthians 15:57 says, "Thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." Victory is already given, but it becomes real in your life when you agree with it and speak it. Jesus is the Word made flesh, so when you speak the Word, you are speaking Jesus.

This is the victory that overcomes the world—our faith. And our faith is our agreement with what God has said. Victory is in your mouth when Jesus is in your mouth. Victory is in your mouth when you speak who He is, what He has done, and who you are in Him.

SECTION 3

THE BELIEVER OPERATES THE SAME WAY GOD OPERATES

Ephesians 5:1 tells us to be imitators of God as dear children. This means we follow His example. We operate the way He operates. God believes what He has spoken, and He speaks what He believes. He calls things that are not as though they were, and He expects His children to do the same.

When you speak the Word, you are not trying to make something happen. You are agreeing with what God has already said. You are aligning your mouth with His truth. This is how faith works. Faith believes what God has spoken, and faith speaks what God has spoken.

Mark 11:22–23 shows us this clearly. Jesus said, “Have faith in God,” and then He immediately taught the principle of speaking. He said that whoever speaks to the mountain and does not doubt in his heart, but believes what he says will come to pass, will have whatever he says. Jesus connected faith with speaking because faith must be spoken to be released.

This is why Romans 10:8 calls the Word “the word of faith which we preach.” Faith is not silent. Faith is not passive. Faith speaks. Faith declares the Word of God in the face of circumstances. Faith speaks the end from the beginning because that is how God operates.

When you speak the Word, you are not denying reality—you are declaring a higher reality. You are speaking from the spirit realm, where God’s promises are already finished. You are calling into manifestation what God has already completed in Christ.

This is how the believer imitates God:

You believe what He has said.

You speak what He has said.

You expect what He has said to come to pass.

This is God's mode of operation, and it becomes your mode of operation.

When your heart believes and your mouth speaks, the Word of God goes to work. Heaven backs your words because your words agree with His Word.

CLOSING — VICTORY IS IN YOUR MOUTH

Proverbs 18:21 says that death and life are in the power of the tongue. This means your words are never empty. Your mouth is always producing something. You are either speaking life or speaking death. You are either agreeing with God or agreeing with the enemy. There is no neutral ground.

Jesus said in Matthew 12:37, “By your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned.” This does not mean God is condemning you. It means **your own words testify for you or against you**. Your words reveal what you believe, and your words determine what you receive.

When you speak what Jesus has provided, your words justify you. Your words agree with His finished work. Your words release salvation, healing, deliverance, strength, and victory. You are speaking what Jesus has already done, and heaven backs every word that agrees with Him.

But when you do not speak what Jesus has provided, your silence or your negative words testify against you. You are not being condemned by God—you are condemning yourself by agreeing with something other than what Jesus has done. This is why the believer must guard their mouth. Your mouth is the doorway through which faith is released.

Victory is not automatic. Victory is spoken. Victory is enforced. Victory is activated when Jesus is on your mouth. When you speak who He is, what He has done, and who you are in Him, you are releasing life. You are releasing faith. You are releasing the power of God into your situation.

This is why it is so important for the believer to keep Jesus on their mouth.

Jesus is the Word. Jesus is your righteousness. Jesus is your victory.

When Jesus is in your heart and on your mouth, victory is in your mouth. And when victory is in your mouth, victory shows up in your life.
